



Wonderful days at NFJ Kysing



The camp of NFJ Kysing is located at Kattegat, the sea between Denmark and Sweden, in the outland of the little old fishing village Norsminde. It is a cozy little place with about 140 units. We have a nice and relaxed atmosphere, talking together and helping each other. We take care of each other and always have an eye on our neighbour's stuff. We are all sorts of people, young - unfortunately not that many - old, thick, thin and what else you could think of. It is a good place to get in contact with new people; you can be open and social and talk with everybody. Campers come from all around Denmark to join the Pentecost lunch. We visit each other for a beer or a cup of coffee. It is also a quiet place where you can have a peaceful time if that is what you need, and keep to your self be on your own spot, where there is much space and lots of birds seeking food and singing.

In the morning the sea can be total calm. You can sit on the bathing jetty dipping your toes in the water, enjoy the sunrise and watch the seagulls and other birds diving for fishes, while the kids are fishing for small crabs.

Every Saturday night you can bring your own food for a common barbecue and enjoy sitting together with the other campers in the diner or on the terrace with direct view over the sea. Some rare times during the summer, if we are lucky we can see Denmark's little whale, the Harbour Porpoise in the evening.

We have a nice beach where you can bring your own stuff and lay in the sand and watch the sea, take a swim or whatever you want to do on a sunny day. The sea is very suitable for swimming longer distances along the coast line as the ocean current almost always goes towards the beach. But you either have to be a Viking or bring a wet suit for swimming longer distances as the water is usually between 18 and 22 degrees Celsius.

The camp is equipped with a big playground for kids. For adults there is beach volley, petanque and chess on the terrace. There is unisex shower, kitchen if you travel in tent and television room. In the evenings you can use the sauna with a direct sea view sit at the camp fire.

I love to walk along the coast from the camp to Norsminde, especially in the morning before everyone else wakes up. In Norsminde you will find a little café where it is possible to have a tasty lunch with seafood. Or you could buy some of the fresh fishes or shellfishes and bring them to the camp and prepare your own lovely meal. In the small villages around the camp you also find stalls with locally grown vegetables, and art galleries.

Some days I want to go for a longer walk and continue following the coastline further north enjoying the wind in my face, the seagulls in the sky and children playing at the beach. Going further north about 20 km, I reach Aarhus - second city of Denmark. Here you find the museum of art, Aros, with the famous rainbow panorama on the roof and the open-air museum, Den Gamle where you can travel through time from about 1700-1970. Or you could go visiting the Grauballe Man, the World's best-preserved bog man from the Iron Age, at Moesgaard Museum. In the first weekend of June you find the little Vikings Blacksmith Market a few kilometers south of the camp and in the last weekend of July you can go for the World's biggest Viking Market at Moesgaard Beach.
